D4I supports countries and local organizations to generate and use high-quality data, investigate program effectiveness, and use evidence for informed decision making. Here we highlight our efforts to strengthen the technical and organizational capacity of local partners and support them along their Journey to Self-Reliance.

#### Assess and Plan

A capacity needs assessment of Kinshasa School of Public Health professors and students will be used to develop a capacity building plan for the school to strengthen its offerings for public health professionals.

### Share Knowledge

A four-part webinar series on complexity-aware evaluations broke records with more than 1,000 attendees overall from around the world seeking to build their evaluation skills.

# **Provide Tools**

A consultation with USAID and an expert group of organizations and networks, held in Ghana, will inform the development of an institutional strengthening toolkit, made stronger through this collaborative effort and feedback.

# **Build Systems**

We helped strengthen child protection and care systems with the Modova Ministry of Health, Labor, and Social Affairs and the National Social Work Agency. We are testing a case management system and strengthening capacity for monitoring and evaluation.
